As introduced in our [August newsletter](#), the FACT working group recently developed “**Wildfire Resilience Zones**” that divide Trout Lake residents into geographic areas with similar wildfire risk factors.

Our goal is for this to assist with the identification, prioritization, and implementation of key wildfire mitigation projects in our community.

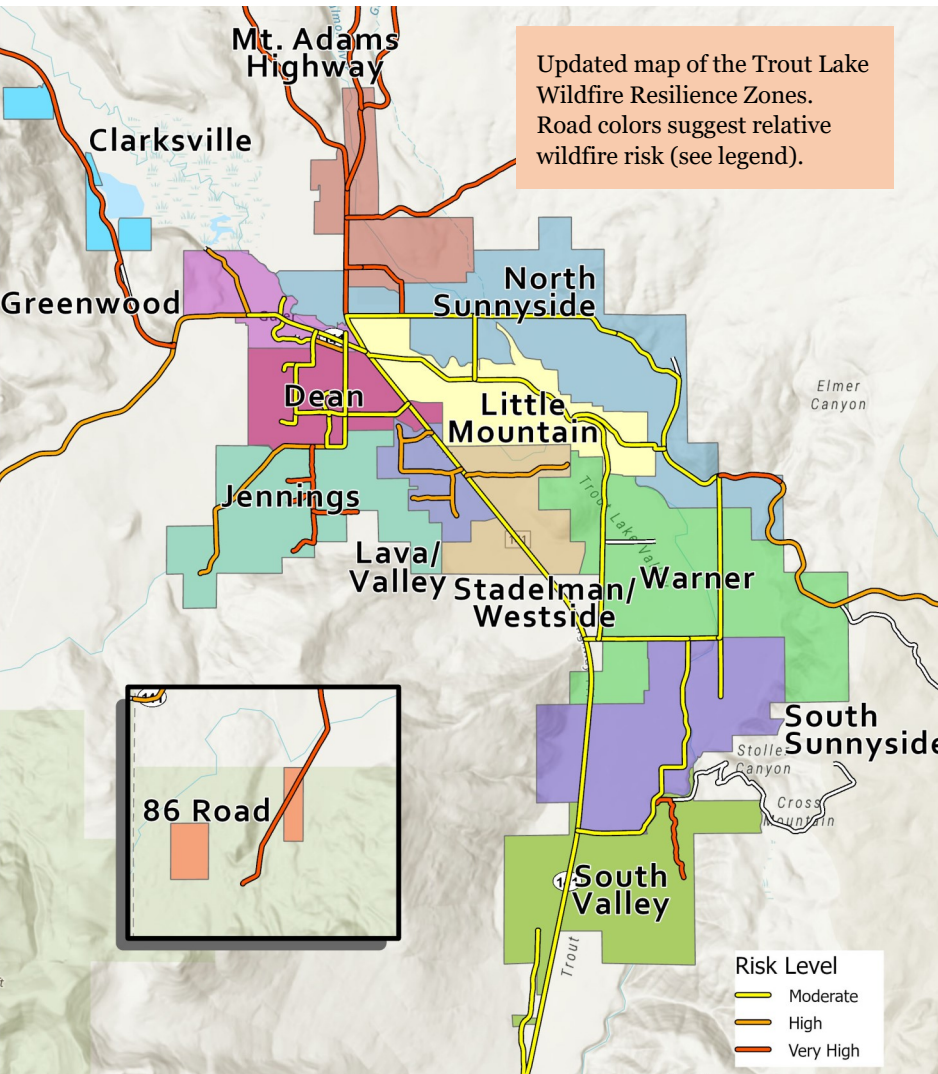
Given the generally higher wildfire risk level, we are initially focusing on **zones west of Highway 141** (Clarksville, Greenwood, Dean, Jennings, and Lava/Valley).

This is where you come in! Have you noticed a particularly worrisome area around your neighborhood that should be addressed? Know a good location for a [shaded fuel break](#) to protect our community? Have you and your neighbors already discussed removing hazardous fuels from your properties and want to get started? Is there something you or others need (physical assistance, equipment, slash removal services, consultation, financial support, etc.) in order to do this work?

We want to hear your ideas, concerns, and priorities—particularly if you’re in one of the west Trout Lake zones mentioned above, but any thoughts are welcome. Here’s how to reach us:
